**The Sunday Trading (Concessionary Period)  
Regulations, 2004**

**THE STATES COMMERCE AND EMPLOYMENT DEPARTMENT**, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 27A of the Sunday Trading Ordinance, 2002<sup>1</sup> and all other powers enabling it, hereby makes the following Regulations: -

**Citation, commencement and interpretation.**

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Sunday Trading (Concessionary Period) Regulations, 2004 and shall come into force on the 27<sup>th</sup> October 2004.

(2) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires -

“concessionary period” has the meaning assigned by section 27A of the 2002 Ordinance; and

“the 2002 Ordinance” means the Sunday Trading Ordinance 2002, as amended by the Sunday Trading (Amendment) Ordinance, 2003<sup>2</sup> and the Sunday Trading (Amendment) Ordinance, 2004.



(3) The provisions of the Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948<sup>3</sup> apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as they apply to an enactment.

**Prescription of "concessionary period"**

2. The months of November, December and January in any year are hereby prescribed for the purposes of paragraph L of the second schedule to the 2002 Ordinance.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations are made under the Sunday Trading Ordinance, 2002, as amended by the Sunday Trading (Amendment) Ordinance, 2003 and the Sunday Trading (Amendment) Ordinance, 2004. They prescribe a concessionary period for the purposes of paragraph L of the Schedule to the 2002 Ordinance, as being the months of November, December and January in any particular year.

The purpose of prescribing a concessionary period is to permit garden centres which are already in possession of a category L Sunday Trading Licence to have Christmas decorations and wrapping paper offered for sale during the concessionary period without being restricted to a single and discrete floor area of 100 square metres.
