**The Aircraft Charges (Alderney Foodstuffs)
Exemption Ordinance, 1951.**

The States Legislation Committee, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on them by paragraph (3) of Article 66 of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and in pursuance of the Resolution of the States of the 25th day of July, 1951, hereby order:—

1. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of the Ordinance Directing a Scale of Charges Applicable to Aircraft, 1946 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”), as amended by the Aircraft Charges (Alderney Freight) Exemption Ordinance, 1950, in determining the charge to be made thereunder under the heading “Cargo Fee” in the Schedule to the principal Ordinance in respect of an aircraft travelling from the Island of Alderney to the United

Kingdom or from the United Kingdom to the Island of Alderney no account shall be taken of any foodstuffs carried by the aircraft provided that the weight of such foodstuffs including the weight of the containers thereof is in excess of 499 pounds avoirdupois.

2. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the expression "foodstuffs" means any article used as food or drink for human consumption, other than drugs or intoxicating liquor, and includes—

- (a) any substance which ordinarily enters into or is used in the composition or preparation of human food ;
- (b) any substance intended for use in human food, being flavouring matter, colouring matter or a condiment ; and
- (c) tea, coffee and cocoa.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1951, and shall cease to have effect on the 31st day of July, 1952.
