ORDINANCE OF THE STATES

Made 3rd September, 1957
Coming into force 4th September, 1957

THE ALDERNEY CONTROL OF FISHING ETC. ORDINANCE, 1957

The States, upon the advice of the Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries have made the following Regulations which shall come into force on September 4th, 1957.

1. Ormers
 - (a) The close season for Ormers shall be from May 1st to September 15th each year, both days included. It shall be an offence for any person to take or be in possession of ormers during this period.
 - (b) The taking of Ormers by diving is hereby prohibited at all times.
2. Size of fish that may be taken

No person shall in Alderney land, sell, expose or offer for sale, or have in his possession for the purpose of sale any fish named in the Schedule annexed hereto of less than the dimensions given in the said Schedule against each respectively.
3. A person committing an offence against any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding £25 or in default of payment thereof to imprisonment not exceeding one month.
4. The Ordinance entitled "The Alderney Fishing etc. Control Ordinance, 1951" is hereby repealed.
