**THE ALDERNEY FIRING OF BRUSHWOOD CONTROL
ORDINANCE, 1954**

The States on the advice of the Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries, hereby order:-

1. The term 'Brushwood' shall mean any whilst growing vegetation in the Island of Alderney, other than cultivated crops.
2. A person shall not fire, cause to be fired or permit any other person to fire any brushwood between 15th March and 31st July of any year without having previously obtained the permission of the States Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries.
3. The States Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries shall not withhold a permit applied for in accordance with section 2 hereof unless it is satisfied that the firing of the brushwood in respect of which the application is made is likely to endanger property, crops or wild life.
4. A person infringing the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten Pounds, or in default of payment of such fine to imprisonment not exceeding one month.
