ORDINANCE OF THE STATES

**THE ALDERNEY LIQUOR LICENSING
(AMENDMENT) (NO 2) ORDINANCE, 1964**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and sixty-four, hereby order -

Amendment of principal Ordinance

1. The Alderney Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1951 (hereinafter in this Ordinance referred to as "the principal Ordinance") as amended, is hereby further amended as follows, that is to say:-
 - (a) in section one thereof, in the definition of the expression "meal", the words "two shillings and threepence" are hereby repealed and the words "eight shillings and sixpence" are hereby substituted therefor
 - (b) in section three thereof -
 - (i) the word "and", immediately after the words "Hotel Licences", is hereby repealed;
 - (ii) for the full-stop after the words "Public House Licences" there is hereby substituted a comma followed by the word "and";
 - (iii) immediately below the reference to Public House Licences there is hereby inserted the following -
"(3) Restaurant Licences.";
 - (c) in subsection (1) of section four thereof, immediately after the word "licence", there are hereby inserted the words "of the first class or second class";
 - (d) in section five thereof -
 - (i) in paragraph (a) thereof, the words "licensed premises" are hereby repealed and the words "premises in respect of which there exists a Hotel Licence or a Public House Licence" are hereby substituted therefor;

- (ii) in paragraph (b) thereof, the word "licensed" is hereby repealed and the word "such" is hereby substituted therefor;
- (e) immediately after section five thereof there is hereby inserted the following additional section -
 - "5A. (1) A person holding a Restaurant Licence in respect of any premises shall not -
 - (a) sell or supply any intoxicating liquor or cause or permit any such liquor to be sold or supplied otherwise than -
 - (i) during the hours of 11a.m. and 3p.m. or during the hours of 7p.m. to 12 midnight on any day, except Good Friday; and
 - (ii) to a person taking a meal there for consumption by such a person with, or as an ancillary to, his meal;
 - (b) permit any intoxicating liquor to be consumed in those premises except during the hours and in the circumstances specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection.
 - (2) A person shall not consume any intoxicating liquor in any premises in respect of which there exists a Restaurant Licence except during the hours and in the circumstances specified in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of this section.";
- (f) in paragraph (b) of section nine thereof -
 - (i) for the semi-colon immediately after the words "ten-shillings" there is hereby substituted a full-stop;
 - (ii) immediately below the reference to Public Houses there is hereby inserted the following -
"Restaurants Twenty-five pounds;"
- (g) immediately after section twenty-two thereof there is hereby inserted the following additional section -
"22A. A person holding a Restaurant Licence shall not expose, or cause or permit to be exposed, any intoxicating liquor in or about the premises in respect of which he holds his licence for the purpose of offering such liquor for sale."

Special provisions relating to applications for, and the grant of, Restaurant Licences

2. (1) A person, before making an application to the Court for a Restaurant Licence under the provisions of the Principal Law, as amended by this Ordinance, shall send to the Clerk of the Court together with the notice required to be given under the provisions of the Alderney Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, a plan to scale of the premises in respect of which he intends to apply for the licence showing the relevant particulars relating to such premises.
- (2) The Court shall not grant a Restaurant Licence in respect of any premises unless it is satisfied -
 - (a) that such premises are bona fide used, or intended to be used, principally for the purpose of habitually providing the customary main meal at midday or in the evening, or both, for consumption in those premises by persons seated at a table;
 - (b) that there is sufficient space in such premises to accommodate not less than twenty-four persons seated at tables in reasonable comfort.
- (3) The Court shall, upon the grant of a Restaurant Licence, specify in the licence the premises in respect of which the licence is granted.

Notice to be exhibited in licensed restaurants

3. There shall be exhibited in a conspicuous position in any premises in respect of which a Restaurant Licence is in force, at all times while the licence is in force, a notice in the form set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance and printed in plain type so as to be legible at least six feet therefrom, and in the case where such premises consist of two or more rooms such notice shall be so exhibited in each of those rooms.

Construction and citation

4. (1) This Ordinance, other than the provisions of section one thereof, shall be construed as one with the Principal Ordinance, as amended.
- (2) This Ordinance may be cited as the Alderney Liquor Licensing (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1964, and this Ordinance, the Principal Ordinance, the Alderney Liquor
