**THE ALDERNEY LIQUOR LICENSING (AMENDMENT)
ORDINANCE, 1960**

THE STATES, on the representation of the States Publicity and Entertainments Committee, hereby order:-

- 1.(1) On and after the coming into force of this Ordinance a person before making application under the provisions of the Alderney Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance") for the grant of a new licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall at least forty-two days prior to the day upon which he proposes to make the application send to the Clerk to the Court a notice in writing which shall specify the situation of the premises concerned and the day on which and the hour at which it is proposed to make the application.
- (2) Upon the receipt of a notice in pursuance of the provisions of the last preceding subsection the Clerk to the Court shall cause a copy of that notice to be displayed on the Notice Board at the Court House and on the notice board at the gate of the Parish Church from the date of the receipt by him of such notice until the date on which it is proposed that the application should be made.
2. On and after the commencement of this Ordinance the Court, upon the day appointed for hearing an application for the grant of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall, before passing orders on the said application, hear any representations in the matter which may be made by any person.
- 3.(1) This Ordinance and the Principal Ordinance shall be construed as one.

(2) This Ordinance, the Alderney Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1958, The Alderney Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and the Principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Alderney Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1951 to 1960.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on 1st September, 1960.
