ALDERNEY REGULATION OF FIREARMS ORDINANCE, 1950

In pursuance of the Loi Ayant Rapport aux Armes a Feu sanctioned by His Majesty in Council on the 21st April, 1922, the States have approved the following Ordinance which shall come into force immediately:

1. In this Ordinance 'Constable' means any Member of the Guernsey Police Force on duty in Alderney and any Special Constable.
2. It shall be an offence under this Ordinance for any person to discharge any firearm for the purpose of shooting game during the hours between sunset and sunrise, *or at any time on Sundays. *
3. Any Constable, acting from his own knowledge or from reliable information, may seize a firearm which has been discharged in contravention of this Ordinance, provided that the firearm so seized shall be produced before the Court at its Session next following the seizure.
4. Any person acting in contravention of this Ordinance who refuses to surrender a firearm demanded by the Constable in accordance with Section 3 above shall, upon conviction before the Court of Alderney, be punishable with a fine not exceeding Ten Pounds. The Court may, in addition to any penalty imposed under this Section, order the suspension or cancellation of the licence held by any person in respect of a firearm used in contravention of this Ordinance.
5. No person under the age of eighteen may hold a licence for a firearm.
