Ordinance of the States VIII 1995

Made 3rd May 1995

Came into operation 3rd May 1995

THE ALDERNEY ROAD TRAFFIC AND PUBLIC HIGHWAYS (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1995

THE STATES OF ALDERNEY, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 3rd day of May, 1995, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of the Government of Alderney Law, 1987(a), hereby order:—

1. In Part V of the Alderney Road Traffic and Public Highways Ordinance, 1966, as amended (b), for section 35 (“regulations”) substitute the following section- **Amendment.**

35. (1) Any Regulations under the provisions of this Ordinance- **Regulations.**

- (a) may be amended or repealed by subsequent regulations hereunder;
- (b) may contain such consequential, incidental, supplemental and transitional provision as may appear necessary or expedient;
- (c) shall be laid before a meeting of the States as soon as possible and shall, if at that meeting the States resolve to annul them, cease to have effect, but without prejudice to anything done under them or to the making of new regulations;

(b) No.'s 47, 119, 142, 154 and 201.

(d) shall have an explanatory note appended to them, which shall-

(i) explain the general purport of the regulations;

(ii) be published in the Alderney Official Gazette; and

(iii) be displayed, as soon as possible, on the public notice board outside the Court House for a period of not less than 7 days;

(c) shall come into force-

(i) on the seventh day after the date of publication of the explanatory note; or

(ii) on such later date (if any) as may be specified in the regulations and set out in the said publication;

(2). Any power conferred by this Ordinance to make regulations may be exercised.

(a) in relation to all cases to which the power extends, or in relation to all those cases subject to specified exceptions, or in relation to any specified cases or classes of cases;

(b) so as to make, as respects the cases in relation to which it is exercised-

(i) the full provision to which the power extends, or any lesser provision (whether by way of exception or otherwise);

(ii) the same provision for all cases, or different provision for different cases or classes of cases, or different provision for the same case or class of case for different purposes;

(iii) any such provision either unconditionally or subject to any prescribed conditions."

2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Alderney Road Traffic and Public Highways (Amendment) Ordinance, 1995.
