The August Bank Holiday Ordinance, 1971

(No. XLII
—1971)

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-one, hereby order:—

1. The last Monday in the month of August, nineteen hundred and seventy-one, shall be a bank holiday instead of the first Monday in that month. Last Monday in August, 1971, to be bank holiday.
2. The reference in section two of the Bank Holidays and Negotiable Instruments (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1955(a), to the first Monday in the month of August shall be construed, as respects the year nineteen hundred and seventy-one, as a reference to the last Monday in the month of August. Reference to the first Monday in August to be construed as respects 1971, as reference to last Monday in August.
3. The May and August Bank Holidays Ordinance, 1970(b), is hereby repealed. Repeal.
