1957

Made 11th December, 1957.
Coming into Operation . . . 1st January, 1958.

**The Building (Amendment) Ordinance,
1957.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Building (Guernsey) Law, 1956, hereby order:—

1. The Article containing the definitions in the Ordinance entitled “Ordonnance relative à la Construction de Maisons, Salles Publiques et Bâtiments et au Tracement de Routes et Chemins” passed on the twenty-fifth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-one (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”) is hereby repealed and the following Article is hereby substituted therefor:—

“In this Ordinance the expression “the Committee” means the States Housing Authority.”.

2. Articles one to fifteen, both inclusive, Articles seventeen to thirty-three, both inclusive, and Articles forty and forty-two of the principal Ordinance are hereby repealed.

3. The Construction of Buildings and Roads (Regulations) Ordinance, 1948, is hereby repealed.

4. Notwithstanding the repeal of any of the provisions of the principal Ordinance, any permit issued under any of those provisions shall remain in force and shall continue to have effect for a period of one year from the date of issue as if it were a licence issued under the provisions of the Building Regulations, 1957.

5. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.
