The Civil Defence (Additional Powers) (Guernsey) Law, 1962

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and sixty-one, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

Additional powers of the [Department].

1. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Civil Defence (Guernsey) Law, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "**the principal Law**") the [Home Department] may take such steps as appear to it from time to time to be necessary or expedient for civil defence purposes and in particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, such steps as appear to it to be necessary or expedient in connection with all or any of the matters set out in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) of subsection (1) of section one of the principal Law.

(2) The [Home Department] in taking any steps in pursuance of the provisions of the last preceding subsection shall not incur any expenditure without either the prior approval of the States or the prior approval of the States [Policy Council] acting in pursuance of such authority in that behalf as may from time to time be conferred upon it by the States by Resolution.

NOTES

In section 1,

the words "Department" and "Home Department" in square brackets, wherever occurring, were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 11, with effect from 6th May, 2004;

the words in the second pair of square brackets in subsection (2) were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 1(a), with effect from 6th May, 2004.

The functions, rights and liabilities of the Civil Defence Committee and of its President arising under or by virtue of this Law were transferred to and vested in, respectively, the Home Department and its Minister by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 1, Schedule 1, paragraph 11, with effect from 6th May, 2004, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 4 of the 2003 Ordinance.

The functions, rights and liabilities of the Advisory and Finance Committee and of its President arising under or by virtue of this Law were transferred to and vested in, respectively, the Policy Council and its Minister by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 1, Schedule 1, paragraph 1(a), with effect from 6th May, 2004, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 4 of the 2003 Ordinance.

Saving.

2. Nothing in this Law contained shall derogate from any of the provisions of the principal Law.

Interpretation.

3. In this Law, the expressions "[Home Department]" and "civil defence" shall have the meanings assigned to those expressions respectively by section six of the principal Law.

NOTE

In section 3, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 11, with effect from 6th May, 2004.

Citation and collective title.

4. This Law may be cited as the Civil Defence (Additional Powers) (Guernsey) Law, 1962, and this Law and the principal Law may be cited together as the Civil Defence (Guernsey) Laws, 1952 and 1962.

NOTE

The Law received Royal Sanction on 25th January, 1962 and was registered on the Records of the Island of Guernsey and came into force on 20th February, 1962.
