THE CONTROL OF DOGS (ALDERNEY) ORDINANCE, 2002

THE STATES OF ALDERNEY, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 46 of, and paragraph (a) of Schedule 2 to, the Government of Alderney Law, 1987, as amended¹, hereby order:-

1. For the purpose of this Ordinance –

Controlled and prohibited places.

- (a) the places mentioned in Part I of the Schedule (including any footpaths adjacent to them) and the places mentioned in Part II of the Schedule are controlled places at all times; and
- (b) the places mentioned in Part III of the Schedule (including any slope, slip or stairs leading to them) are controlled places in the months of June, July, August and September.

2. (1) A person in charge of a dog shall not permit the dog to be –

Control of dogs.

- (a) in any of the controlled places mentioned in Part I of the Schedule at any time, unless the dog is kept on a lead;

- (b) in any of the controlled places mentioned in Part II of the Schedule at any time, or in any of the controlled places mentioned in Part III of the Schedule at any time during the months of June, July, August and September, unless the dog is –
 - (i) a guide dog or a hearing dog which at the time is in the charge of a blind person or, as the case may be, a deaf person, or
 - (ii) a police dog or a customs dog which at the time is in the charge of an officer of police or, as the case may be, an officer of customs and excise who in either case is on duty at the time.
- (2) A person in charge of a dog shall not permit the dog to foul any controlled place mentioned in Part I, II or III of the Schedule by depositing its faeces thereon.
- (3) A person in charge of a dog in any controlled place mentioned in Part I, II or III of the Schedule or in any public place shall immediately remove any faeces deposited there by the dog.
- (4) In subsection (3) the expression to “**remove**” means to remove the faeces from that place and from any other place referred to in that subsection or to deposit the faeces in a receptacle provided for the specific purpose.

Offences.

- 3. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of section 2 is guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the Alderney uniform scale.

Interpretation.

- 4. (1) In this Ordinance –
 - “**officer of customs and excise**” means an officer within the meaning of section 1(1) of the Customs and Excise (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1972²;
 - “**officer of police**” means a member of the salaried police force of the Island of Guernsey, any member of any police force which may be established by the States of Alderney and, within the limits of his jurisdiction, a member of the Alderney Special Constabulary;

“**owner**”, in relation to a dog in respect of which a licence has been issued in accordance with the provisions of the Dog Licences (Guernsey) Law, 1969³, as extended by the Alderney (Application of Legislation) (Dog Licences) Ordinance, 1969⁴, means the person to whom the licence was issued;

“**person in charge**”, in relation to a dog, means the person having control or charge of the dog at the time of the alleged offence; and if no person has control or charge of the dog at that time, the owner of the dog shall be deemed to be the person in charge of it at that time;

“**public place**” means any place to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access, whether on payment of a fee or otherwise.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948⁵ applies to the interpretation of this Ordinance as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

(3) Any reference in this Ordinance to an enactment shall, except where the context otherwise requires, include a reference thereto as amended, repealed and replaced (with or without modifications), extended or applied.
