THE CONTROL OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR
(ALDERNEY) ORDINANCE, 2000

THE STATES OF ALDERNEY, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 46 of, and paragraphs (g) and (m) of Schedule 2 to, the Government of Alderney Law, 1987(a), and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

- 1. A minor who consumes or attempts to consume, or who is found in possession of, any intoxicating liquor in a public place shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the Alderney uniform scale. **Minor consuming alcohol in public place.**
- 2. A person who supplies or attempts to supply any intoxicating liquor to a minor in a public place shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding level 4 on the Alderney uniform scale, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both. **Person supplying alcohol to minor in public place.**
- 3. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect the consumption or supply of any intoxicating liquor in connection with a religious service or ceremony. **Savings**
- 4. (1) In this Ordinance, unless the context requires otherwise - **Interpretation.**

“**minor**” means a person under the age of 18 years;

“intoxicating liquor” includes spirits, wines, beer, porter, cider and perry and any other liquor with an alcoholic content intended for human consumption, but excludes any liquor where the alcoholic content is less than two degrees of proof spirit;

“public place” includes any road, street or lane and any other premises or place to which at the material time the public have or are permitted to have access, whether on payment or otherwise.

- (2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Ordinance.

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Alderney) Ordinance, 2000.
