The Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1953.

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Administration and the States Board of Health, and in pursuance of the powers now vested in them under Article XI of the Loi ayant rapport à l'Importation, l'Exportation, la Manufacture, la Vente et l'Emploi d'Opium et d'autres Drogues Dangereuses dans les Iles du Bailliage, registered on the Records of this Island on the 7th day of March, 1931, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. The Loi ayant rapport à l'Importation, l'Exportation, la Manufacture, la Vente et l'Emploi d'Opium et d'autres Drogues Dangereuses dans les Iles du Bailliage, registered on the Records of this Island on the 7th day of March, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), as amended by the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1949, is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) immediately after the drugs numbered “(12)” in Cédule A to the principal Law there are hereby inserted the following additional drugs numbered “(13)”—

“(13) 3-Methoxy-N-methylmorphinan (that is to say, dextromethorphan, levome-thorphan and racemethorphan) its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 3-methoxy-N-methylmor-phinan.”;

- (b) in Schedule II of Schedule D to the principal Law the following drugs are hereby deleted—

Linctus Diamorphinæ Camphoratus B.P.C.

Linctus Diamorphinæ c.Ipecacuanha
B.P.C.

Linctus Diamorphinæ et Scillæ B.P.C.

Linctus Diamorphinæ et Thymi B.P.C.

2. This Ordinance and the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1949, may be cited together as the Dangerous Drugs Ordinances, 1949 and 1953.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 8th day of April, 1953.
