The Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1954.

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Administration and of the States Board of Health and in pursuance of the powers now vested in them under Article XI of the Law entitled “Loi ayant rapport à l’Importation, l’Exportation, la Manufacture, la Vente et l’Emploi d’Opium et d’autres Drogues Dangereuses dans les Iles du Bailliage”, registered on the Records of this Island on the 7th day of March, 1931, as amended, and of all others powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. The Law entitled “Loi ayant rapport à l’Importation, l’Exportation, la Manufacture, la Vente et l’Emploi d’Opium et d’autres Drogues Dangereuses dans les Iles du Bailliage”, registered on the Records of this Island on the 7th day of March, 1931, as amended, is hereby further amended by the deletion

of the drug numbered “(14)” in Cédule A to that Law and the substitution therefor of the following drugs—

“(14) N-Allynormorphine (commonly known as Nalorphine), the salts thereof and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of N-Allynormorphine”.

2. The Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Ordinance, 1953, is hereby repealed.

3. This Ordinance, the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1949 and the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1953, may be cited together as the Dangerous Drugs Ordinances, 1949 to 1954.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 18th day of February, 1954.
