Ordinance of the States **XLVII** 1972

Made 25th October, 1972.
Came into Operation ... 25th October, 1972.

The Decimal Currency and Legal Tender (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1972

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, hereby order:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Decimal Currency Ordinance, 1968(a), the coin to be issued by the States of Guernsey on the twentieth day of November, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, and specified to have a value of twenty-five pence shall have a value of the same number of new pence and shall form part of the legal currency of the Islands of Guernsey, Sark, Herm and Jethou.

Special coin to be legal currency.

2. For the purposes of being used for any payment in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Legal Tender (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1970(b), a coin issued by the States of Guernsey on

or after the first day of November, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, specified on the obverse or reverse side thereof to have a value of such number of pence as is so specified shall be treated as having a value of the same number of new pence.

Extent.

3. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Sark, Herm and Jethou.

Citation.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as the Decimal Currency and Legal Tender (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1972.
