The Decimal Currency Ordinance, 1968

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, hereby order:—

1. (1) On and after the day appointed by Her Majesty's Treasury as the day on and after which, in pursuance of the provisions of the Decimal Currency Act 1967, the denominations of money in the currency of the United Kingdom shall be the pound sterling and the new penny, the new penny being one hundredth part of a pound sterling, the legal currency of the Islands of Guernsey, Sark, Herm and Jethou and the denominations thereof shall be the pound sterling and the said new penny.

The new decimal currency.

(2) Such notes and coins as may from time to time be issued by the States on and after the day appointed as aforesaid shall have a value equivalent

to that of corresponding notes and coins issued in the United Kingdom.

Citation. 2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Decimal Currency Ordinance, 1968.
