ORDER IN COUNCIL



IN THE ROYAL COURT OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY

The 1st day of December, 2003 before Geoffrey Robert Rowland, Esquire, Deputy Bailiff; present:— David Charles Lowe, Laurence Lenfestey Guille, Derek Martin Le Page, Stephen Edward Francis Le Poidevin, Alan Cecil Bisson, David Michael Jory, Keith Bichard, OBE, Esquires, The Reverend Peter Gerald Lane, Michael John Wilson, Michael John Tanguy, Esquires, and Susan Mowbray, Jurats.

The Deputy Bailiff having this day placed before the Court an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 8th day of October, 2003, approving and ratifying a *Projet de Loi* of the States of Guernsey entitled “The Dog Licences (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2003”, THE COURT, after the reading of the said Order in Council and having heard Her Majesty’s Comptroller thereon, ORDERED that the said Order in Council be registered on the records of this Island.

THE FOLLOWING, report from the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Jersey and Guernsey was today read at the Board:

“IN ACCORDANCE WITH YOUR MAJESTY’S General Order of Reference of the 22nd day of February 1952 the Committee have considered a petition of the States of Guernsey:”

“That, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 30th of April, 2003, the States of Deliberation at a meeting on the 31st July, 2003, approved a Projet de Loi entitled “The Dog Licences (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2003” and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction to it. That the Projet de Loi is as set forth in the attached Schedule. The Petition most humbly prays that Your Majesty might be graciously pleased to sanction “The Dog Licences (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2003” and to order that it shall have force of law in the Island of Guernsey.

“THE COMMITTEE have considered the Projet de Loi and have agreed to report that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to approve and ratify it.”

HER MAJESTY, having taken the Report into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi (a copy of which is annexed to this Order) and to order that it, together with this Order, shall have the force of law in the Islands of Guernsey and shall be entered on the Register of the Island of Guernsey and observed accordingly.

HER MAJESTY'S Officers in the Bailiwick of Guernsey, and all others whom it may concern, are therefore to take notice of Her Majesty's Order and to proceed accordingly.

PROJET DE LOI

ENTITLED

The Dog Licences (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2003

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of 30th April 2003^a, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the Island of Guernsey^b :-

Amendment of Law of 1969.

1. In the Dog Licences (Guernsey) Law, 1969, as amended^c, after section 2(b), insert -

"(c) in respect of a dog kept and used solely by a deaf or disabled person or such other category of person as the States may by Ordinance specify, for their hearing or guidance, as the case may be."

Citation.

2. This Law may be cited as the Dog Licences (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2003.
