The Fishing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1967

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-seventh day of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, hereby order:—

1. The Fishing Ordinance, 1955, as amended^(a), is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) the word “or” at the end of paragraph (i) of section one thereof is hereby repealed;
- (b) the full stop at the end of paragraph (j) of section one thereof is hereby deleted and a semi-colon is hereby substituted therefor and immediately thereafter there is hereby inserted the word “or” and the following additional paragraph “(k)”—

“(k) escallops measuring less than four inches along a horizontal plane between perpendiculars at the extremities of a line drawn between the two most distant extremities of the shell.”.

2. Section two of the Fishing (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1964(b), is hereby repealed and the following section is hereby substituted therefor—

“2. (1) A person shall not, while he is totally or partially submerged and breathing with the aid of submarine breathing apparatus or wearing a diving suit, a face visor, a mask or goggles, take ormers in those parts of the territorial waters of this Island specified in paragraphs one, two and three of the Schedule to this Ordinance.

(2) A person who, on surfacing after having been totally or partially submerged and breathing with the aid of submarine breathing apparatus or wearing a diving suit, a face visor, mask or goggles in the said territorial waters, is found to have in his possession any ormers shall be deemed to have contravened the provisions of the last preceding subsection unless he can prove that he did not take the ormers while he was so totally or partially submerged.

(3) In this section the expression “submarine breathing apparatus” includes the apparatus commonly known as a “snorkel”, and any other diving device whatsoever.”
