The Fishing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1972

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, hereby order:—

1. The Fishing Ordinance, 1969, as amended^(a), is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) in subsection (1) of section eleven thereof the word “,escallops” is repealed;
- (b) immediately after the words “Third Schedule to this Ordinance” there are inserted the words “or take scallops in any part of the territorial waters of this Island within a quarter of a mile of the shore of the Island of Guernsey measured from the low water mark of ordinary spring tides between an imaginary line drawn due south-west from the British Broadcasting Corporation’s television masts, in the parish

of Torteval, along the west coast, around the north coast and thence along the east coast of the Island of Guernsey and an imaginary line drawn from the Belvedere Light through the Castle Breakwater Light, in the parish of Saint Peter Port, and produced in a north-easterly direction”;

(c) in the heading to the Third Schedule thereto the word “escallops” is repealed.

Citation. 2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fishing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1972.

Collective title. 3. This Ordinance and the Fishing Ordinances, 1969 to 1971, may be cited together as the Fishing Ordinances, 1969 to 1972.
