The Foot and Mouth Disease (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952.

THE STATES LEGISLATION COMMITTEE, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by paragraph (3) of Article sixty-six of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and upon the representations of the States Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries, hereby order:

1. Section six of the Foot and Mouth Disease Ordinance, 1950, (hereinafter called "the principal Ordinance") is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

"6. (1) The Board may by order—

(a) declare the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou or any part of any of them to be an Infected Area, and such order shall have effect, subject to any exemption in writing granted by the Board, so as to—

(i) prohibit the movement of any animal out of or into the Infected Area;

- (ii) prohibit the movement of any animal across or along any public road, lane or footpath within the Infected Area ;
 - (iii) prohibit the watering of any animal at any stream within the Infected Area ;
 - (iv) prohibit the grazing of any animal within the Infected Area unless that animal is securely tethered or securely confined within its grazing area ;
 - (v) require the owner or person in charge of any dog to ensure that the dog is secured by a leash or chain not exceeding ten feet in length unless that dog is inside a building or in an enclosure from which it cannot escape.
- (b) prohibit the export of any animal from any of the said Islands.

(2) The States Veterinary Officer shall, if so instructed by the Board, inspect any animal within an Infected Area, and shall submit a report of any such inspection to the Board.

(3) For the purposes of this section any farm or holding which is partly within and partly without an Infected Area shall be deemed to be wholly within that Area, and detached parts of farms or holdings wholly outside an Infected Area shall be deemed to be separate farms or holdings."

2. This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance shall be construed together and this Ordinance and that Ordinance may be cited together as The Foot and Mouth Disease Ordinances, 1950 and 1952.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 13th day of May, 1952.
