The Harbour Dues Ordinance, 1958

THE STATES, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (3) of section one and section six of the Harbour Dues (Saint Peter Port and Saint Sampson) Law, 1957, and in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-ninth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, hereby order:—

1. (1) Harbour dues payable under the provisions of section three of the Harbour Dues (Saint Peter Port and Saint Sampson) Law, 1957 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law") shall not be paid by the owner of a vessel remaining in the harbour of Saint Peter Port, the harbour of Saint Sampson or the roadstead after the expiration of a period of fourteen days commencing on the day of entry if that vessel is a vessel to which this section applies.

(2) A vessel is a vessel to which this section applies—

- (a) if, when trading, it is solely engaged in trading between two or more places within the Bailiwick of Guernsey; or
- (b) whilst, for a period not exceeding three consecutive months from the date of its last entry, it is in the harbour of Saint Peter Port or the harbour of Saint Sampson for the purpose of undergoing repairs and if such repairs are carried out by persons none of whom is at the time a member of the crew of that vessel.

2. The figure and letter "5d." in the column headed "Rate per net registered ton" of the Schedule to the principal Law where that figure and letter first occur are hereby deleted and the figure and letter "7d." are hereby substituted therefor.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.
