**The Eggs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1969**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-eighth day of May, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine, hereby order:—

1. Article 3 of the Ordinance entitled “Ordonnance relative au Marquage d’Oeufs” made on the twenty-fourth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-six<sup>(a)</sup> (hereafter in this Ordinance referred to as “the principal Ordinance”) and the marginal heading thereto are hereby repealed and the following Article and marginal heading are hereby substituted therefor—

“Cards to be displayed near eggs exposed for sale indicating whether imported or not.” 3. No hen eggs or duck eggs shall be exposed for sale unless there is displayed near every such egg on a card of not less than 3 inches in length and 2 inches in breadth and in plain block letters not less than half an inch in height, in the case of such eggs produced in the Island of Guernsey, the word “GUERNSEY”, and,

in the case of such eggs produced elsewhere than in the Island of Guernsey, the word "IMPORTED".

2. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Eggs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1969, and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Eggs Ordinances, 1936 and 1969.

(2) This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine.
