**The Electoral Expenditure Ordinance, 1993**

**THE STATES**, in pursuance of their Resolutions of 25th November, 1992(a) and 29th September, 1993(b), and in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Article 44(1) of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948(c) as applied by Article 53 of that Law, by section 6 of the Reform (Election of Conseillers and Minor Amendments) (Guernsey) Law, 1993(d), and by Article XVII(6) of the Public Assistance Law, 1937(e), as amended(f), hereby order:-

**Electoral expenditure: Conseillers.**

1. A candidate in an election for the office of Conseiller may, during the 28 days immediately preceding the date of the election, expend money or give value in money's worth in respect of that election up to a maximum of £750.

**Electoral expenditure: People's Deputies.**

2. A candidate in an election for the office of People's Deputy may, during the 28 days immediately preceding the date of the election, expend money or give value in money's worth in respect of that election up to a maximum of

- (a) 11 pence multiplied by the number of people whose names are inscribed on the section of the Electoral Roll relating to the Electoral District in which he is a candidate; and in addition
- (b) £150.

**Electoral expenditure: Constables, Douzeniers, Procureurs and Overseers of the Poor.**

3. A candidate in an election for the office of Constable, Douzenier, Procureur of the Poor or Overseer of the Poor may, during the period commencing on the 14th day immediately preceding the date fixed for the election and ending on the date when the election in fact takes place, expend money or give value in money's worth in respect of that election up to a maximum of

- (a) 2.75 pence multiplied by the number of people whose names are inscribed on the section of the Electoral Roll relating to the Parish concerned; and in addition
- (b) £40.

**Repeals.**

4. The Electoral Expenditure Ordinance, 1990(g) and the Electoral Expenditure (Procureurs and Overseers of the Poor) Ordinance, 1992(h) are repealed.

**Citation.**

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Electoral Expenditure Ordinance, 1993.
