The Electoral Expenditure Ordinance 2000

The Electoral Expenditure Ordinance, 2000

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of 24th November, 1999¹ and in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Article 44(1) of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948² as applied by Article 53 of that Law, and by Article XVII(6) of the Public Assistance Law, 1937³, as amended⁴, hereby order:-

Electoral expenditure: People's Deputies

1. A candidate in an election for the office of People's Deputy may, during the 28 days immediately preceding the date of the election, expend money or give value in money's worth in respect of that election up to a maximum of

- (a) 13 pence multiplied by the number of people whose names are inscribed on the section of the Electoral Roll relating to the Electoral District in which he is a candidate; and in addition
- (b) £183.

Electoral expenditure: Constables, Douzeniers, Procureurs and Overseers of the Poor

2. A candidate in an election for the office of Constable, Douzenier, Procureur of the Poor or Overseer of the Poor may, during the period commencing on the 14th day immediately preceding the date fixed for the

- (a) 3.25 pence multiplied by the number of people whose names are inscribed on the section of the Electoral Roll relating to the Parish concerned; and in addition
- (b) £46.
