**The Electricity (Guernsey) Ordinance,
1956.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 26th day of January, 1955, and of the powers vested in them by section one of the Electricity (Modification) (Guernsey) Law, 1955, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. The provisions of section thirty-one of the Law entitled "Loi relative à la Fourniture de l'Electricité par les Etats, 1933" shall, during the continuance in force of this Ordinance, be varied by the substitution for the requirements with respect to any electrical apparatus fixed or placed in any premises to which electrical energy is or is about to be supplied by the States Electricity Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), or to any such apparatus which is altered in position or extent or by replacement or

repair, of the requirement that any electrical apparatus fixed or placed as aforesaid shall not be used after it has been fixed or placed as aforesaid or after the same or any part thereof has been altered in extent until such use has been approved by or on behalf of the Board.

2. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of April, 1956.
