**THE EMPLOYMENT PERMITS (ALDERNEY)**  
**ORDINANCE, 1976**

**THE STATES**, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections one, four and five of the Employment Permits (Alderney) Law, 1975(a), hereby order:-

**Appointment of day for the purposes of the Law of 1975.**

1. The day appointed for the purposes of paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section one of the Law shall be the 4<sup>th</sup> day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy-six.

**Appeals to the Court of Alderney.**

2. An appeal to the Court under the provisions of subsection (1) of section four of the Law from a decision of the Committee shall, within the forty-two days next following the date of the decision, be instituted by way of summons which shall set out the material facts upon which the appellant relies and which shall be served on the Chairman of the Committee to show cause why the decision appealed from should not be varied or set aside.

**Service of notices.**

3. Any notice or other document required or authorised by the Law to be served on any person shall be validly served –

- (a) on any person if delivered to him, left or sent by registered post or by recorded delivery service to him at his usual or last known place of abode;
- (b) on any firm, if delivered to any partner of the firm, or left at, or sent by registered post or by recorded delivery service to, the principal or last known principal place of business of the firm;
- (c) on the body corporate, if left at, or sent by registered post or by recorded delivery service to, its registered office if situate in the Island, or, if its registered office is not so situate, its principal or last known principal place of business in the Island.

### **Interpretation.**

4. (1) In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "the Law" means the Employment Permits (Alderney) Law, 1975, and other expressions shall have the same meaning as in the Law.

(2) Except insofar as the context otherwise requires, any reference in this Ordinance to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by any other enactment, including this Ordinance.

### **Citation and Commencement.**

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Employment Permits (Alderney) Ordinance, 1976, and shall come into force on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy-six.
