**The Import and Export of Trees, Wood
and Bark (Health) (Amendment)
Ordinance, 1984**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 25th day of April, 1984, hereby order:—

1. (1) The Import and Export of Trees, Wood and Bark (Health) Ordinance, 1982(a), (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”) is hereby amended in accordance with the following provisions of this section.

(2) In section 1(1) (Interpretation) the following definition is inserted immediately after the definition of “the Court”—

“ “Cut tree” means any part of the trunk of a tree which has been severed from its roots and still retains branches and foliage; ”.

(a) No. XXIV of 1982.

(3) In the Second Schedule (tree pests the landing of which is prohibited if carried on or infecting certain trees or wood) in Part I there are inserted in the second column at the end of the entry numbered 2 the words "and trees of conifers (including cut trees).".

(4) In the Third Schedule (trees and isolated bark the landing of which is prohibited when grown in specified countries)—

(a) the following entries are inserted in the first and second columns immediately after the entry numbered 2:

(b) the words "France or" are inserted at the beginning of the words in the second column of the entry numbered 3.

(5) In the Fourth Schedule (special conditions subject of which the landing is permitted in this Island of specified trees, wood, isolated bark and soil)—

(a) in the entry numbered 1, in the first column there are inserted immediately after the words "grown in" the words "France or in";

(b) the following entry is inserted in the first and second columns immediately after the entry numbered 8:

" 8A. (a) Trees of conifers (Coniferae) (other than cut trees or fruit and seeds), grown in any country or part of a country in Europe, and which— Each consignment shall be accompanied by an official statement that no symptoms of *Dendroctonus micans* have been observed at the place of production or its immediate vicinity since the beginning of the last complete cycle of vegetation.

(i) are of three metres in height or less; or

(ii) have been grown in a nursery.

- (b) Cut trees of conifers (*Coniferae*) of three metres in height or less grown in any country or part of a country in Europe.

Each consignment shall be accompanied by an official statement certifying—

- (i) that no symptoms of *Dendroctonus micans* have been observed at the place of production or its immediate vicinity since the beginning of the last complete cycle of vegetation; and
- (ii) that the cut trees do not derive from the tops of trees over three metres in height other than trees grown in a nursery. ”.

(6) In the Fifth Schedule (phytosanitary certificates to accompany imported trees, wood, isolated bark and soil)—

- (a) in Part I, the following entries are substituted for the entry numbered 5:

“ 5. (a) Trees of conifers (*Coniferae*) (other than cut trees or fruit and seeds), grown in any country or part of a country in Europe, and which—

(i) are of three metres in height or less; or

(ii) have been grown in a nursery.

- (b) Cut trees of conifers (*Coniferae*) of three metres in height or less grown in any country or part of a country in Europe.”;

(b) in Part II, in the entry numbered 2 there are inserted immediately after the words "grown in" the words "France or in";

(c) in Part III the following entries are inserted immediately after the entry numbered 1:

"1A. (a) Trees of conifers (*Coniferae*) (other than cut trees or fruit and seeds), grown in any country or part of a country in Europe, and which—

(i) are of three metres in height or less; or

(ii) have been grown in a nursery.

(b) Cut trees of conifers (*Coniferae*) of three metres in height or less grown in any country or part of a country in Europe."

(d) In Part III, in the entry numbered 2 there are inserted immediately after the words "grown in" the words "France or in".

2. Unless the context otherwise requires, a reference in this Ordinance to a numbered section, subsection, Schedule, Part of a Schedule or entry is a reference to the section, subsection, Schedule, Part of a Schedule or entry so numbered in the principal Ordinance. Interpretation.

3. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Import and Export of Trees, Wood and Bark (Health) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1984. Citation and collective title.

(2) This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Import and Export of Trees, Wood and Bark (Health) Ordinances 1982 and 1984.
