

The Motor Traffic (Sark) Ordinance, 1948.

1. A person being in charge of a motor vehicle other than a motor tractor of a make and type approved by the Court of Chief Pleas shall not proceed on any public road in this Island.
2. A person being in charge of such a motor tractor as aforesaid shall not proceed on any public roads in this Island at a speed in excess of five miles per hour.
3. A person being in charge of such a motor tractor as aforesaid shall not proceed therewith on the road between La Collenette and La Vauroque or by way of Clos-a-Joan except when such a tractor is required to be used for purposes of haulage as defined below, or for purposes of Agriculture on any land situate on or adjoining that road.
4. A person being in charge of such a tractor may use the same on the public roads of this Island at any time for Agricultural purposes only, excepting to and from the Harbour.
5. A person being in charge of such a tractor may proceed to the Harbour for purposes of haulage of goods which are:-
 - (a) over or 15 cwt. in weight.
 - (b) are for delivery to one place only except fuel.
6. The Court on the recommendation of the Constable may give permission for the use of motor tractors on the roads of this Island for other purposes than those specified above where circumstances warrant.
7. All motor tractors which are used for haulage (as distinct from any used solely for Agriculture) shall pay an Annual tax of £2 to the Constable who shall grant a permit for haulage.
8. Any person contravening any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an Offence and shall be liable on conviction before the Court to a fine not exceeding £2 and to an order suspending or in exceptional cases rescinding the permit.
9. It is hereby forbidden to any person being in charge of a tractor to use the same between La Collenette and the Harbour between the hours of 11 and 12 a.m. and 4 and 5 p.m. from Easter to Michaelmas.
10. For the purposes of this Ordinance the expression "motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.
11. The Ordinance ayant rapport aux Automobiles, passed at the Chief Pleas held on the 30th day of September, 1936, is hereby repealed.
