**The Health Service (Benefit) (Limited List) (Pharmaceutical Benefit)
(Amendment No. 3) Regulations, 2008**

THE SOCIAL SECURITY DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 10 and 35 of the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990 as amended¹, section 1 of the Health Service (Benefit) (Limited Lists) Ordinance, 2004² and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment

1. In the Schedule to the Health Service (Benefit) (Limited List) (Pharmaceutical Benefit) Regulations, 2004³, as amended, delete the row set out in Schedule 1 to these Regulations, under the appropriate headings.

Extent

2. These Regulations shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

Interpretation

3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948⁴ applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

Citation

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Health Service (Benefit) (Limited List) (Pharmaceutical Benefit) (Amendment No. 3) Regulations, 2008.



EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport)

These Regulations remove from a limited list of drugs and medicines available as pharmaceutical benefit which may be ordered to be supplied by medical prescriptions issued by medical practitioners or dentists, as the case may be.
