The Health Service (Pharmaceutical) (Payment of Approved Suppliers)
(Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976

Made 28th May, 1976
Laid before the States
Coming into operation 1st June, 1976

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section twelve of the Health Service (Pharmaceutical) (Guernsey) Law, 1972, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment of regulation two of the principal regulations

1. Sub-paragraph (e) of paragraph (1) of regulation two of the Health Service (Pharmaceutical) (Payment of Approved Suppliers) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976 (hereafter in these regulations referred to as "the principal regulations"), is hereby repealed and the following sub-paragraph is hereby substituted therefor -

"(e) where that item is a controlled drug within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1974, and it has been supplied on a medical prescription endorsed with the initial letters "C.D." by the approved supplier, an additional dispensing fee of fifteen pence."

Saving

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation one of these regulations, the principal regulations shall continue to apply in respect of any item of pharmaceutical benefit supplied on a medical prescription (within the meaning of the principal regulations) issued before the first day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-six, in all respects as if these regulations had not been made.

Citation and commencement

3.(1) These regulations may be cited as the Health Service (Payment of Approved Suppliers) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-six.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport)

These regulations amend the Health Service (Pharmaceutical) (Payment of Approved Suppliers) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976, consequentially upon the coming into force on the 1st June, 1976, of the substantive provisions of the Misuse of Drugs (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1974, under which drugs which were formerly designated "dangerous drugs" are designated "controlled drugs". Medical prescriptions issued on and after that date and on which such drugs are ordered to be supplied will, therefore, be marked with the initials "C.D." instead of with the initials "D.D.A.".
