The Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section one and section seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders -

Amendment to regulation two of the principal regulations

1. In paragraph (b) of regulation two of the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964, as amended, there are hereby inserted, immediately after the words "fifty-two weeks", the words "or such longer period as the Authority may in any particular case think fit".


Citation, collective title and commencement

2. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976.

(2) These regulations and the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 to 1975, may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 to 1976.

(3) These regulations shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and seventy-six.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

These Regulations enable the Authority to extend beyond fifty-two weeks the period during which a person who is not ordinarily resident in Guernsey is excepted from liability for insurance under the Law.
