The Emergency Powers (Declaration of State of Emergency)
(Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Repeal) Order, 1976

WHEREAS the States of Guernsey Emergency Council, being of opinion that the grave diminution of the Island water resources did constitute a state of emergency, on the nineteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and seventy-six, made the Emergency Powers (Declaration of State of Emergency) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1976, declaring that a state of emergency existed:

AND WHEREAS in the opinion of the said Emergency Council the Island water resources are such that the said state of emergency should be terminated:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the provisions of the Emergency Powers (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1965, the States of Guernsey Emergency Council hereby repeals the Emergency Powers (Declaration of State of Emergency) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1976.
