ARRANGEMENT OF PROVISIONS

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The Medicines (Human) (General Sale List) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 2009

THE HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 28 and 132 of the Medicines (Human and Veterinary) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2008^a and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

General sale list.

1. A medicinal product is specified for the purposes of section 28(1) of the Law (general sale lists) if it is of a description or class set out in Article 2 of the UK Order (general sale list).

Automatic machines section of a general sale list.

2. A medicinal product is designated as a medicinal product in the automatic machines section of a general sale list for the purposes of section 28(3) of the Law (general sale lists) if it is of a description or class set out in Article 3 of the UK Order (automatic machines section of the general sale list).

Interpretation.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context requires otherwise -

"the Law" means the Medicines (Human and Veterinary) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2008^b; and

"UK Order" means the Medicines (Products other than Veterinary Drugs) (General Sale List) Order 1984^c.

(2) A reference in this Order to an enactment, or any provision or part of it, is a reference to it as amended, or re-enacted or re-made (with or without modification), or extended or applied by or under any enactment.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^d applies to the interpretation of this Order –

(a) throughout the Bailiwick, and

(b) for the avoidance of doubt, as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

(4) For the avoidance of doubt, unless the context otherwise requires, an expression used in this Order has the same meaning as in the Law.

Extent.

4. This Order has effect throughout the Bailiwick.

Citation and commencement.

5. This Order may be cited as the Medicines (Human) (General Sale List) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 2009 and comes into force on the 1st October, 2009.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

If a medicinal product is on the general sale list, it can be sold outside of a pharmacy. This Order provides that a medicinal product is on the general sale list in the Bailiwick if it is on the general sale list in the United Kingdom. The Medicines (Human) (Sale or Supply) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Regulations, 2009 set out certain conditions which must be followed in respect of the sale of medicinal products.
