**The Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) (Amendment)
Regulations, 2008**

Made 1st December 2008

Laid before the States

Coming into operation 1st January 2009

THE GUERNSEY SOCIAL SECURITY AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 14 and 35 of the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990, as amended¹, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendments.

1. The five Schedules to the Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 2003, as amended² are revoked and replaced by the five Schedules set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Interpretation.

2. (1) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these regulations to any enactment or regulations shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment or those regulations, as the case may be, as amended, repealed, replaced, revoked, extended or applied, by or under any other enactment or by any other regulations.

(2) The Interpretation Guernsey Law, 1948³ shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

Citation.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) (Amendment) Regulations, 2008.



EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations amend the Schedules to the Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 2003 by increasing the graduated fees paid to pharmacists not employed by a medical practice.
