**The Land Planning and Development
(Immunity Certificate Fee) Regulations, 2009**

THE ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 3(3)(b) of the Land Planning and Development (Enforcement) Ordinance, 2007^a and section 89 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005^b, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

Fee to accompany application for an immunity certificate.

1. The prescribed fee that must accompany an application for an immunity certificate, under section 3(3) of the Land Planning and Development (Enforcement) Ordinance, 2007, is £50.

Interpretation.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context requires otherwise -

"enactment" means any Law, Ordinance or subordinate legislation,

"immunity certificate" shall be construed in accordance with section 3(8) of the Land Planning and Development (Enforcement) Ordinance, 2007, and

"subordinate legislation" means any regulation, rule, order, rule of court, resolution, scheme, byelaw or other instrument made under any enactment and having legislative effect.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^c applies to the interpretation of these Regulations.

(3) Any reference in these Regulations to an enactment is a reference thereto as from time to time amended, re-enacted (with or without modification), extended or applied.

Citation and commencement.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Land Planning and Development (Immunity Certificate Fee) Regulations, 2009 and shall come into force on the 6th April, 2009.
