ORDINANCE OF THE STATES

Made 10th April, 1962
Coming into force 11th April, 1962

THE NOISE ABATEMENT (ALDERNEY) ORDINANCE, 1962

The States on the advice of the Agricultural and Estates Committee hereby order:-

1. Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding section, any person who operates or attempts to operate a loudspeaker -

- (a) in a public place, or
- (b) for advertising purposes,

shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding two pounds and in the case of a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

2. The provisions of the last preceding section shall not apply to the operation of a loudspeaker:-

- (a) which is or forms part of the horn or similar warning instrument of a vehicle and is operated solely for giving warning to other traffic;
- (b) for police, fire brigade, ambulance or civil defence purposes;
- (c) by a servant of the States in connection with his duties at Braye Harbour or at the Alderney Airport;
- (d) on a vessel if used solely for navigational or warning purposes;
- (e) with the permission granted by Act of the Court of Alderney in that behalf in connection with a public function, meeting or entertainment.

3. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:-

"loudspeaker" includes a megaphone, a wireless set and any other device for amplifying sound;

"public place" means any highway, road, footpath, square, court, beach, cliff, foreshore or any other place to which the public have or are permitted to have access other than a building.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as the Noise Abatement Ordinance, 1962.
5. This Ordinance shall come into force on the eleventh day of April, 1962.
