**The Liquor Licensing (Amendment) No. 2
Ordinance, 1951.**

The States Legislation Committee, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by paragraph (3) of Article sixty-six of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and in pursuance of a Resolution of the States of the 20th day of June, 1951, hereby order:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section five of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") and Part I of the Second Schedule thereto, any establishment in respect of which there exists a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquors, other than a Club Licence, a General Off-Licence or a Beer Off-Licence, may on every week day during such part of the current

summer period as remains unexpired at the coming into force of this Ordinance, be open for such sale and for supply, as authorised by that licence, from 2 p.m. until 11 p.m. in addition to such opening hours prior to 2 p.m. as are permitted by that Section and that Part of that Schedule.

2. The expression "summer period" in this Ordinance shall have the meaning assigned to it in the principal Ordinance.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 21st day of June, 1951.
