**The Liquor Licensing (Amendment)
(No. 2) Ordinance, 1971**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolutions of the twenty-fourth day of February and of the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-one, hereby order:—

1. The Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1960, as amended(a), is hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) immediately after section thirty-two thereof there is inserted the following additional section numbered “32A”—

“Display
of sale
price list.

32A. (1) The holder of an Hotel Licence, Public Hall Licence, Inn Licence, Public House Licence, Café Licence, Restaurant Licence, Residential Licence or Airport Licence shall cause to be conspicuously displayed in every bar and in every other part of the licensed premises in which intoxicating

liquor is sold or supplied or exposed for sale or supply a list showing plainly the prices per measure at which are sold—

1971.

- (a) brandy, whisky, rum, gin and vodka;
- (b) port, sherry, vermouth and other fortified wines; and
- (c) beer, porter, cider and perry;

for consumption on the premises in respect of which he holds such liquor licence.

(2) In this section the expression "measure" means in respect of—

- (a) brandy, whisky, rum, gin and vodka, one fluid ounce;
- (b) port, sherry, vermouth and other fortified wines, a quantity of not less than one and sixty-seven hundredths of a fluid ounce; and
- (c) beer, porter, cider and perry, if draught, per half pint or ten fluid ounces and per pint or twenty fluid ounces, if from a stoppered bottle or sealed container, per bottle or container, as the case may be.”;

- (b) section thirty-seven thereof is repealed;
- (c) in section sixty-seven thereof immediately after the words "thirty-two" there are inserted the words "or section thirty-two A"

and in the marginal heading to that section the words and figures "section 32" are repealed and the words and figures "sections 32 and 32A" are hereby substituted therefor;

- (d) paragraph 5 of Part I of the Third Schedule thereto is repealed and the following paragraph is substituted therefor—

"5. Airport Licences.

- (a) the hour on any day at which the Terminal Building at La Villiaze Airport is opened for use —10.30 a.m.:
 Provided that during that period a licensee who is the holder of an Airport Licence shall not sell or supply or permit the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor—

- (i) other than wines and spirits in stoppered sealed containers; or
 (ii) to any person for consumption on the premises in respect of which he holds that licence;

- (b) 10.30 a.m.—to the end of promulgated hours or 11.00 p.m. whichever time is the earlier:

Provided that if, during any day or days, La Villiaze Airport is officially closed for flying by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration, a licensee who is the holder of an Airport Licence shall not exercise that licence during that period."

Repeal.

2. The Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1971, is hereby repealed.

3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1971. 1971.
Citation.

4. ~~This Ordinance, the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1971, and the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1960 to 1968,~~ may be cited together as the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1960 to 1971. Collective

5. (1) The provisions of this Ordinance, other than paragraphs (a) and (c) of section one thereof, shall come into force on the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-one. Commence-
ment.

(2) The provisions of paragraphs (a) and (c) of section one of this Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and seventy-one.
