Coming into operation 1st May, 1951

**The Liquor Licensing (Amendment)
Ordinance, 1951.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 7th day of March, 1951, hereby order:—

1. In section two of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1948, (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”), the definition of “a meal” is hereby amended by the substitution of the words “two shillings and threepence” for the words “one shilling and sixpence”.

2. Sub-section (1) of section seventeen of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion, between the words “Public House licence” and the words “or Beer licence”, of the words “Guest House licence, Café licence, Restaurant licence”.

3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and this Ordinance and the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1948 to 1950, may be cited together as the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1948 to 1951.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 1st day of May, 1951.
