**The Liquor Licensing (Amendment)  
Ordinance, 1952.**

The States Legislation Committee, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by paragraph (3) of Article sixty-six of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and in pursuance of a Resolution of the States of the 16th day of April, 1952, hereby order :—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section five of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") and Part one of the Second Schedule thereto, any establishment in respect of which there exists a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor, other than a Club Licence, a General Off-Licence or a Beer Off-Licence may on every week day during the current summer period be open for such sale and for such supply as is authorised by that licence, from 2 p.m. until 11 p.m. in addition to such opening hours until 2 p.m. as are permitted by that Section and that Part of that Schedule.

2. The expression "summer period" in this Ordinance shall have the meaning assigned to it in the principal Ordinance.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 21st day of April, 1952.
