**The Liquor Licensing (Amendment)  
Ordinance, 1954.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 17th day of February, 1954, hereby order:—

1. The Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1948, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section eight thereof is hereby repealed;
- (b) sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section eight thereof is hereby repealed;
- (c) in subsection (1) of section nine thereof the words "save in the case of a Guest House licence which may be renewed only on application to the Royal Court" are hereby repealed;
- (d) immediately after section twelve thereof there is hereby inserted the following additional section numbered "12A"—

“ 12A. On the day of the hearing of an application for an Hotel, Inn or Guest House licence by the Royal Court, the Tourist Committee or a person authorised by them in that behalf shall submit a written report containing the views of that Committee respecting the application.”.

2. This Ordinance and the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1948 to 1953, may be cited together as the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1948 to 1954.
