**The Liquor Licensing (Amendment)
Ordinance, 1965**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-fourth day of February, nineteen hundred and sixty-five, and on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order:—

1. The Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1960(a), as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) immediately after section thirty-one thereof there is hereby inserted the following additional section numbered “31A”—

“Measures
of certain
spirits and
wines.

31A. (1) The holder of an
Hotel Licence, Public Hall
Licence, Inn Licence, Public
House Licence, Café Licence,
Restaurant Licence, Residen-
tial Licence or Airport

Licence shall not sell or supply or permit the sale or supply of—

- (a) brandy, whiskey, rum, gin or vodka otherwise than in quantities of one fluid ounce or a multiple thereof;
- (b) port, sherry, vermouth or any other fortified wine otherwise than in quantities of one and sixty-seven hundredths of a fluid ounce or a multiple thereof;

for consumption on the premises in respect of which he holds the liquor licence.

(2) The holder of a liquor licence of any of the categories specified in the last preceding subsection shall not sell or supply or permit the sale or supply of, nor shall any servant or agent of his sell or supply, any of the intoxicating liquors specified in that subsection to a person at a bar counter for consumption on the premises in respect of which the liquor licence is held otherwise than in a manner or at a place which

enables the person to whom the intoxicating liquor is being sold or supplied to see, without special request, the liquor being measured from the optic, glass or other measuring device which is being used for such sale or supply.

(3) Nothing in the provisions of the last two preceding subsections shall apply to the sale or supply of any of the intoxicating liquors specified therein when sold or supplied prepacked in a stoppered or sealed container or as a constituent of a mixture of two or more intoxicating liquors.”;

- (b) in section sixty-five thereof immediately after the word “thirty” there are hereby inserted the words “or subsection (2) of section thirty-one A” and in the marginal heading to that section the words and figures “section 30” are hereby repealed and the words and figures “sections 30 and 31A(2)” are hereby substituted therefor;
- (c) in section sixty-six thereof immediately after the words “thirty-one” there are hereby inserted the words “or subsection (1) of section thirty-one A” and in the marginal heading to that section the words and figures “section 31” are hereby repealed and the words and figures “sections 31 and 31A(1)” are hereby substituted therefor.

2. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1965.

(2) This Ordinance and the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1960 and 1963, may be cited together as the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1960 to 1965.

(3) This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
