

The Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of 11th June 1998^a, hereby order:-

Amendments relating to Sundays

1. In the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1993^b:

(a) throughout the Ordinance, including the Arrangement of Sections, the Part and Section headings, and the Schedules, but excluding section 105, for "meal permit" and "meal permits", wherever appearing, there is substituted "family permit" and "family permits" respectively;

(b) for section 43(2) there is substituted:

"(2) A family permit will allow the provision of intoxicating liquor on licensed premises:

(a) with a meal, on any day other than Good Friday or Christmas Day, until 12.45 a.m.;

(b) with a meal, on Good Friday and on Christmas Day (except on a Sunday) during the permitted hours;

(c) with or without a meal, between 12 noon and 3.30 p.m. on Sundays.";

(c) in section 112(1):

(i) immediately after the definition of "the Committee" there is inserted:

"a family permit" means a permit granted under the provisions of section 43 of this Ordinance;"

- (ii) the definition of "a meal permit" is repealed;
- (d) in paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Second Schedule for the entries relating to Sunday there is in each case substituted:

Sunday: In accordance with a family permit granted under section 43 -

- (i) 12 noon - 3.30 pm;
- (ii) (if intoxicating liquor served with a meal) 6.00 pm - 12.45 am on Monday morning."

2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998.

Commencement

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on 1st August 1998.

Transitional provisions

4. With effect from 1st August 1998:
 - (a) any meal permit granted under section 43(1) of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1993 and in force immediately before that date shall be deemed to be a family permit granted under that section, and shall remain valid, subject to the other provisions of that Ordinance, until 31st December 1998;
 - (b) any condition imposed by the Royal Court on such a permit shall continue in force whilst it is deemed to be a family permit;

- (c) any certificate issued under section 50, or displayed in accordance with section 51, of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1993 in respect of such a permit shall be deemed until 31st December 1998 to be a family permit certificate;
- (d) any application for a meal permit then pending before the Royal Court shall be treated as an application for a family permit.
