Ordinance of the Chief Pleas

entitled

The Liquor Licensing (General Provisions)
(Amendment) (Sark) Ordinance, 1984

THE CHIEF PLEAS OF SARK, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (1) of section eight of the Reform (Sark) Law, 1951(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and in pursuance of their Resolution of the eighteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and eighty-four, hereby order:-

1.(1) The Liquor Licensing (General Provisions) (Sark) (Ordinance), 1979, as amended, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is hereby further amended as follows, that is to say:-

(a) in the ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS thereto -

(i) immediately after the entry relating to section twenty-two there is inserted the following entry relating to section "22A" -

"22A. Conditions of exercise of
Restaurant Licence.";

(ii) immediately after the entry relating to section twenty-five there is inserted the following entry relating to section "25A" -

"25A. Display of notice concerning
offences by and in connection
with young persons.";

(b) immediately after subsection (2) of section nine thereof there is inserted the following subsection numbered "(3)" -

"(3) The Court shall not grant a Restaurant Licence in respect of any premises unless it is satisfied that the premises, in respect of which the licence is applied for, are adapted for the service and consumption of intoxicating liquor to and by persons seated at a table.";

(c) immediately after section twenty-two in Part II thereof there is inserted the following additional section numbered "22A" -

"Conditions of exercise of Restaurant Licence.	22A.(1) A person holding a Restaurant Licence for any premises shall not sell or supply any intoxicating liquor or cause or permit any such liquor to be sold or supplied otherwise than to a person taking a meal there for consumption with his meal.

(2) A person shall not consume any intoxicating liquor in any premises in respect of which there exists a Restaurant Licence except in the circumstances specified in subsection (1) of this section."

(d) immediately after subsection (2) of section twenty-five in Part II thereof there is inserted the following additional section numbered "25A" -

"Display of 25A. A liquor notice concern- licensee shall cause to ing offences be displayed at all times by and in in a prominent place in connection with the licensed premises in young persons. respect of which he holds a liquor licence, in such manner as to be easily read by persons using the licensed premises, a notice, in clear and legible black letters on a white background, in the terms and the form set out in the First Schedule to this Ordinance.";

(e) in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section forty-six -

- (i) in sub-paragraph (1) thereof the words "twenty-five pounds" are repealed and the words "fifty pounds" are substituted therefor;
- (ii) in sub-paragraph (ii) thereof the words "fifty pounds" are repealed and the words "one hundred pounds" are substituted therefor;
- (iii) in sub-paragraph (iii) thereof the

words "one hundred pounds" are repealed and the words "two hundred pounds" are substituted therefor;

(f) in paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section forty-six -

(i) in sub-paragraph (i) thereof the words "twenty-five pounds" are repealed and the words "fifty pounds" are substituted therefor;

(ii) in sub-paragraph (ii) thereof the words "fifty pounds" are repealed and the words "one hundred pounds" are substituted therefor;

(g) in subsection (2) of section forty-six in Part III thereof the words "or section twenty-one" are repealed and a comma and the words "section twenty-one or section twenty-two A" are substituted therefor;

(h) in the First Schedule thereto there is inserted after category 3 the following additional category numbered "4" -

"4. Restaurant Licence."

2. The Schedule to the Liquor Licensing (General Provisions) (Amendment) (Sark) Ordinance, 1981 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1981 Ordinance") is repealed and the Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance is hereby substituted therefor.

Repeal.

3. The 1981 Ordinance is repealed.

Citation.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (General Provisions) (Amendment) (Sark) Ordinance, 1984.

Collective
title.

5. This Ordinance and the Liquor Licensing (General Provisions) (Sark) Ordinances, 1979 and 1980 may be cited together as the Liquor Licensing (General Provisions) (Sark) Ordinances, 1979 to 1984.

Commencement.

6. This Ordinance shall come into force on the day of nineteen hundred and eighty-four.

N O T I C E

Offences by and in connection with persons under eighteen years of age.

1. It is an offence for a person under the age of sixteen years to purchase or attempt to purchase intoxicating liquor on licensed premises -
Maximum penalty for contravention £50.
2. It is an offence for a person under the age of eighteen years to purchase or attempt to purchase spirits on licensed premises -
Maximum penalty for contravention £50.
3. It is an offence for another person to purchase or attempt to purchase intoxicating liquor for consumption by a person under the age of sixteen years on licensed premises -
Maximum penalty for contravention £50.
4. It is an offence for another person to purchase or attempt to purchase spirits for consumption by a person under the age of eighteen years on licensed premises -
Maximum penalty for contravention £50.

N.B. This Notice is for information only and in cases of doubt reference should be made to section thirty of the Liquor Licensing (General Provisions) (Sark) Ordinance, 1979.
