**The Liquor Licensing (Rates of Fees)
Ordinance, 1950.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolutions of the 20th day of October, 1948, and of the 31st day of May, 1950, hereby order:—

1. Section 10 of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1948, is hereby amended by the repeal of the words and figures following the words “the following licences:—” and the substitution therefor of the following words and figures—

“ Club licences	£15	os.	od.
Hotel licences	£37	10s.	od.
Inn licences	£30	os.	od.
Public House licences ...	£22	10s.	od.
Café licences	£22	10s.	od.
Restaurant licences	£7	10s.	od.
Guest House licences ...	£7	10s.	od.
General Off-licences	£18	os.	od.
Beer Off-licences	£3	os.	od.
Beer licences	£2	5s.	od. for the first year and £1 11s. 6d. for each subsequent year.”

2. Sub-section (4) of section 15 of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1948, is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted therefor—

“(4)(a) The fee payable on an application for a Special licence shall be—

(i) if a licence is granted—

(a) for a licence for the sale or supply in licensed premises of intoxicating liquor during non-permitted hours, £1 for each hour or part of an hour of extension;

(b) for a licence for such sale or supply in unlicensed premises, 10s. od. for each hour or part of an hour during which such sale or supply is permitted, provided that not more than £3 be charged in respect of any one day; or

(ii) if a licence is not granted, the sum of 10s. od.

(b) The applicant shall pay, by stamps, in advance to the Treasurer of the States such sum as would be payable under this sub-section if his application had been granted in full, and at the conclusion of the hearing the said Treasurer shall refund to him the difference, if any, between that sum and the sum actually payable under the last preceding paragraph.

(c) The said Treasurer shall credit to the Royal Court and to the Greffe, in equal half shares, the sum of 10s. od. in respect of every application made under this sub-section.”

3. The Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1948 and 1949, the Liquor Licensing Amendment Ordinance, 1950, and this Ordinance may be cited together as the Liquor Licensing Ordinances, 1948 to 1950.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 30th day of June, 1950.
