The Marriage (Fees) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1956.

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 13th day of December, 1950, and of their Resolution of the 25th day of January, 1956, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section three of the Marriage (Amendment) Law, 1951, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. The fees payable to the Registrar General and, in the case of Sark, to the Deputy Registrar, in respect of and in connection with, marriages, shall be those set out in the First Schedule to this Ordinance.

2. For each certified copy of the registration of a marriage transmitted to the Registrar General in accordance with the provisions of Article seven of the Law entitled "Loi ayant rapport aux Mariages célébrés dans les Iles de Guernesey, d'Auregny et de

Serk" registered on the 6th day of May, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), the Treasurer of the States shall, in the case of an officiating minister of the Church of England, pay the sum of two shillings and shall, in the case of any other officiating minister or a person authorised under the provisions of the principal Law, pay the sum of one shilling, after being furnished with a certificate for that purpose by the Registrar General.

3. The Laws set out in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent specified in the second column of that Schedule.

4. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Sark, Herm and Jethou.

5. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of April, 1956.
