—1970)****The May and August Bank Holidays  
Ordinance, 1970**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-sixth day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy, hereby order:—

Last Monday in May, 1970, and last Monday in August, 1970, to be bank holidays.

1. (1) The last Monday in the month of May, nineteen hundred and seventy, shall be a bank holiday instead of the Monday in Whitsun Week in that year.

(2) The last Monday in the month of August, nineteen hundred and seventy, shall be a bank holiday instead of the first Monday in that month.

References to Monday in Whitsun Week and the first Monday in August to be construed, as respects 1970, as references to last Monday in May and last Monday in August, respectively.

2. The reference in section two of the Bank Holidays and Negotiable Instruments (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1955(a), to the Monday in Whitsun Week shall be construed, as respects the year nineteen hundred and seventy, as a reference to the last Monday in the month of May, and the reference in that Ordinance to the first Monday in the month of August shall be construed, as respects that year, as a reference to the last Monday in the month of August.

Repeal.

3. The September Bank Holiday Ordinance, 1969(b), is hereby repealed.

Extent.

4. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

Citation.

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the May and August Bank Holidays Ordinance, 1970.
