**The Parochial Collection of Refuse
(Application to the Parish of Torteval)
Ordinance, 1959**

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section seven of the Parochial Collection of Refuse (Guernsey) Law, 1958, it is provided that the States may, from time to time, by Ordinance provide that the provisions of the said Law shall have effect in any Parish if there has been previously received by the President of the States a copy, certified as true by the Dean of the Douzaine, of a resolution of a Parish meeting of that Parish requesting that such provision should be made:

AND WHEREAS the President of the States has received a copy, certified as true by the Dean of the

Douzaine of the Parish of Torteval, of a resolution of a Parish meeting of the said Parish, dated the eleventh day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine, requesting that provision be made by Ordinance that the said Law should have effect in the Parish of Torteval:

NOW THEREFORE THE STATES, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (2) of section seven of the Parochial Collection of Refuse (Guernsey) Law, 1958, hereby order:—

The provisions of the Parochial Collection of Refuse (Guernsey) Law, 1958, shall, as from the date of the coming into force of this Ordinance, have effect in the Parish of Torteval.
