**The Passenger Vessels (Amendment)  
(Bailiwick of Guernsey) Ordinance, 1974**

THE STATES, in exercise of the powers now vested in them by section seventy-one and section seventy-two of the Law entitled "Loi relative à la Marine Marchande dans le Bailliage de l'Île de Guernesey" registered on the sixth day of June, nineteen hundred and sixteen<sup>(a)</sup>, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and seventy-four, and on the representations of the States Board of Administration, hereby order:—

1. (1) The special conditions incorporated, by subsection (2) of section six of the Passenger Vessels (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Ordinance, 1970 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance")<sup>(b)</sup>, in a passenger certificate issued by the Board under section eight of the Law in respect of a local motor vessel shall have effect subject to the succeeding provisions of this section, that is to say:—

- (a) when the vessel is used to carry passengers during darkness and it is equipped with radar apparatus for the operation of which at least one operator who is fully competent to operate the same is on board and with radio telephone apparatus in respect of which there is for the time being in force a licence issued by the Minister and at least one operator licensed by the Minister is on board, the provisions of sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of the said subsection (2) shall not apply in relation to that vessel, and
- (b) when the vessel is used as aforesaid and is equipped as aforesaid and no passengers are landed on the Island of Herm, in addition, the provisions of sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (b) of the said subsection (2) shall not apply in relation to that vessel,

if, after being used as aforesaid—

- (i) the vessel arrives at the Harbour of Saint Peter Port not later than one hour after midnight terminating the day on which it departed from the said Harbour, and
- (ii) the master or man-in-charge immediately on the arrival of the vessel at the said Harbour notifies the watchman at the Signal Station at the said Harbour of the fact of such arrival.

(2) In subsection (1) of section eight of the principal Ordinance the expression “any of the said special conditions” shall include any such condition having effect by virtue of the last preceding subsection.

2. The definition of the expression "the summer period" and the definition of the expression "the winter period" in subsection (1) of section one of the principal Ordinance are hereby repealed and the following definitions are hereby respectively substituted therefor—

"the summer period" means the period commencing on the first day of April or Good Friday, whichever is the earlier, in any year and ending on the thirty-first day of October in that year;

"the winter period" means the period commencing on the first day of November in any year and ending on the thirty-first day of March or the day immediately preceding Good Friday, whichever is the earlier, in the year next following;".

3. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Passenger Vessels (Amendment) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Ordinance, 1974.

(2) This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance shall be construed as one.

(3) This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Passenger Vessels (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Ordinances, 1970 and 1974.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of August, nineteen hundred and seventy-four.
